STOCKING YOUR CLINIC (MEDICATIONS)

Here are a few medications you will need to stock, or write prescriptions for:

For medication abortion:

Mifepristone
Misoprostol
Ibuprofen
Hydrocodone with acetaminophen
Rhogam (50ug dose sufficient through 13 weeks gestation)
Contraceptive methods

For aspiration abortion:

Ibuprofen
Doxycycline and / or Azithromycin, Metronidazole
Lidocaine +/- bicarbonate +/- vasopressin
Anti-emetic rectal suppositories or Ondansetron SL
Methergine/ergonovine (PO/IM)
Misoprostol
Benadryl
Epinephrine
Atropine (optional)
Ammonium "smelling salts"
Rhogam (50ug dose sufficient through 12 weeks' gestation)
Contraceptive methods

STOCKING YOUR CLINIC (SUPPLIES)

Front Desk

Pregnancy wheels	Phone scripts for abortion questions
Insurance and fee information	Referral numbers

Exam Room

Ultrasound machine (not required)	Cannulas
Vaginal probe (not required)	Needle extenders (with 1.5 inch, 22 gauge needles) or 20 x 3 ½ Spinal needles, if applicable
Drape sheets	Syringes (control top, preferable)
BP cuff	Pillow for exam table
Kleenex	Pitcher of water and cups for mifepristone
Chux	Maxi-pads
Flashlight	Indirect lighting
Knee stirrups or soft padding on foot stirrups	Hooks for clothes
Emesis basins or bags for vomiting	Chair for support person
Extra sterile medical equipment (small and large spec, tenaculum, MVA parts, dilators)	

Tip: You can make your procedure room more comfortable for patients by:
Turning an exam light against the wall instead of overhead fluorescent lighting.
Hanging a calming mobile or poster over the exam table.
Playing calming music in the clinic or rooms.

Recovery Room (or place where patients will recover)

Patient information handouts	
Patient referrals	Birth control samples
Brown bags for supplies/contraception	Ginger ale
Condom basket	Crackers
Emergency contraception (packs or prescriptions)	Patient journal (for comments/sharing experiences with other patients)

Lab (or where you will check products of conception)

Red biohazard bags	Running water to rinse POC
Strainer	Tweezers or tissue forceps
Shallow clear glass or plastic bowl (Pyrex dish)	Handheld magnifying lens
Light source, back light (a slide light box)	Rhogam in the lab refrigerator
	Containers with fixative for sending

tissue to pathology

Tip: Find a laboratory where you can send tissue and blood for hCG.

Oral airways

Uterotonics
